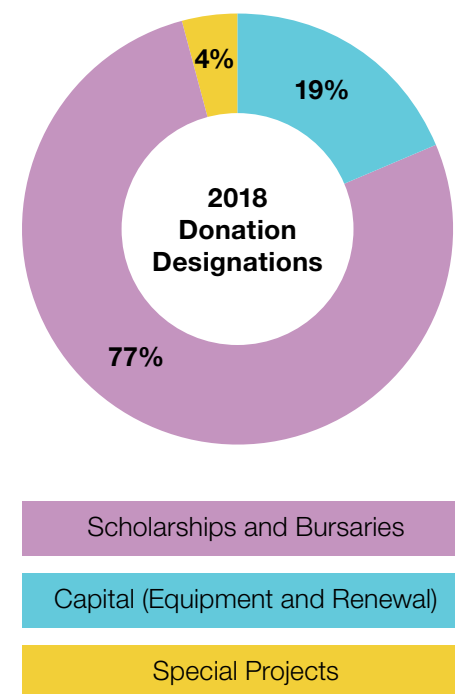
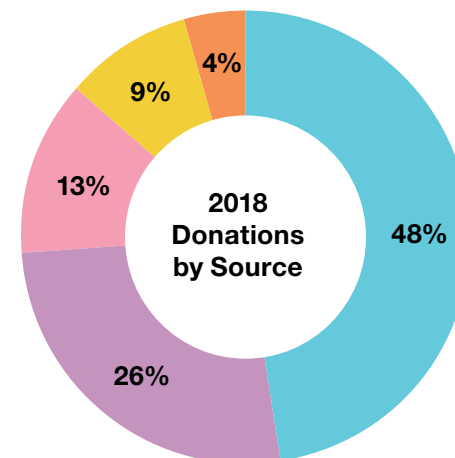
This report is a reflection of the impact our supporters and partners have achieved. Their support and commitment to higher education, Cambrian College, and our students is simply exceptional.

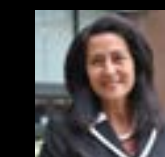

In the years that followed, Max struggled, and he was forced to leave high school, but Max didn't let his new learning disability keep him down. He focused, he adapted, and he pushed on. His goal was to become a Registered Nurse. He wanted to make sure others also overcame and preserved through their own personal hurdles.

Four years later, Max is studying at Cambrian in pursuit of his Bachelor of Science in Nursing.

"I need to focus 100 percent on my studies due to my condition," says Max. "The bursary I received has been vital to my success. With the support of Cambrian donors, I have been able to follow my dreams."

### STEPHANIE COTE GIRARD

Stephanie Cote Girard is in her third year of the Medical Laboratory Technology program at Cambrian College. She lives in Timmins and works as a lab attendant for Public Health Ontario, where their laboratory has a long history of retaining technologists in the north. She was encouraged by her fellow colleagues to upgrade her education, expanding her opportunities in her field.

She has faced many challenges since beginning. The toughest one... being a mother away from her two young children. Stephanie makes a 600-kilometre round-trip every week, between Timmins and Sudbury while working tirelessly to maintain her studies.

She has taken an unpaid leave from work and is renting a room in Sudbury. In addition to her own expenses such as tuition, books, living, and travel, she also contributes to all the bills back home, including a mortgage, utilities, insurance, taxes, and more.

Becoming a technologist has always been her goal, noting that it will add immense value to herself, her family and her community, as she plans on staying in the north to ensure people have the services they need.

Stephanie shared a quote with us that means a lot to her: "Challenges are what make life interesting, overcoming them is what makes life meaningful."

## DONOR SPOTLIGHT

### JESSE WINTERS

Jesse Winters has been a generous Cambrian College donor for over 15 years. He has established two bursaries: the first in honour of a loved one, and the second to reward students who share a common passion, running.

The Dorothy Winters Memorial Bursary was established in 2003 to assist nursing students as they complete their final years of education. Preference is given to students who have experience working with physically or mentally challenged individuals. The bursary is in tribute to Jesse's mother, Dorothy, who was

also a nurse. He recalls the stories she told of her time studying nursing in Thunder Bay, where she lived on site at the local hospital residence 11 months out of the year.

The Sudbury Masters Running Club Bursary is also supported by Jesse Winters. Running is one of his greatest passions. He has been featured in magazines and media and can be seen blazing trails with the Sudbury Masters Running Club all across the north, and the world, participating in marathons in Ottawa, Boston, Green Bay, Chicago, Berlin, New York City, and London, just to name a few.

This bursary is awarded to any student participating in cross-country running at Cambrian who demonstrates a shared passion for running.

Looking back at his own education, Jesse recalls the financial struggles he had to overcome as a student. He believes that an education is more than just time in a classroom and that students are enriched by the entire academic and campus experience. He wants each of the bursaries he supports to help students succeed without the distraction of financial stress.

### MARY DONATO

Mary Donato has been a member of the Cambrian College family for nearly two decades, donating annually to the Frank Donato Memorial Award in her husband's memory. This annual award was initially established by Frank's colleagues at Cambrian College after his passing in 2000. It has since been carried on by Mary.

"I have continued to support Frank's memorial bursary for all these years because I really want to keep his memory alive and commemorate his time at Cambrian," says Mary. "I enjoy meeting the student recipient

every year, hearing their interests and aspirations, and sharing a little about Frank."

Frank joined the Cambrian College family in 1968. He was a professor of math and physics, and was on campus the day the very first computer arrived. Mary fondly remembers young Frank's first days at the College. "John Koski, the College's president at the time, actually thought Frank was a student!"

Frank could fix anything – from cameras and computers to cars

and anything else around the house or in the garage. His affinity for solving problems and helping others was driven by his curiosity and his generous spirit. His memorial bursary is designed to assist students who demonstrate the same inquisitiveness, creativity, and initiative he embodied.

Frank truly made a lasting impact on the College. "Students who were invested in their future and really trying received his full support," says Mary. He was admired by his students and his colleagues and was always willing to help with any problems they had.

Profile:

### ELIZABETH VINASSAC

Elizabeth chose to leave a lasting legacy through a bequest specifically for Indigenous students studying at Cambrian College. Her contribution commemorates Sgt. Francis Pegahmagabow, regarded as the most decorated Indigenous Canadian to fight in the First World War.

Francis is one of only 38 Canadian troops to have earned the Military Medal (MM) with two bars, each representing an act of valour. He earned the first in 1917 at the Battle of Passchendaele, and the second in 1918, during what would prove to be the final hundred days of the war, by charging into heavy enemy fire to retrieve ammunition for his comrades.

When asked why she chose to leave a legacy gift, Elizabeth reflected, "A legacy gift has the tremendous potential to have a significant impact on someone's life. It is important to me to help a disadvantaged party of society. There is no better legacy than supporting the next generation."

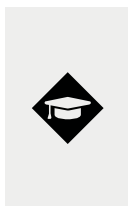
# ALUMNI RELATIONS UPDATE

It's been an exciting, busy, and historic year for all at the Cambrian College Alumni office.

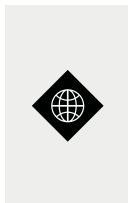

In March 2018, Cambrian College celebrated its golden anniversary with a trip down memory lane to look back at the last half-century of the school's history.

◆ In October, President Bill Best was joined by Greater Sudbury Mayor Brian Bigger and former Sudbury MPP and Ontario Energy Minister Glenn Thibeault – local leaders and Cambrian alumni – to unveil a time capsule that contains items from the past 50 years.
