**USE** your personal network – talk to family and friends

**VISIT** trade associations and union offices to ask if they are hiring

VISIT places you would like to work, drop off your resume, talk to the manager and check their job postings

**POST** your resume on hiring websites such as:

**NOTE: You may** need to move to another part of Ontario to go to school, complete your training or find the work you want

# WHAT IS AN APPRENTICESHIP?

It is TRAINING that teaches you **SKILLS** to be successful in a TRADE

10-20% of training is IN CLASS or ONLINE

80-90% of training is **ON THE JOB** 

**In-class or online training takes** place through a COLLEGE, UNION OR PRIVATE TRAINING CENTRE

Depending on the trade it takes 2-5 YEARS to complete an apprenticeship
